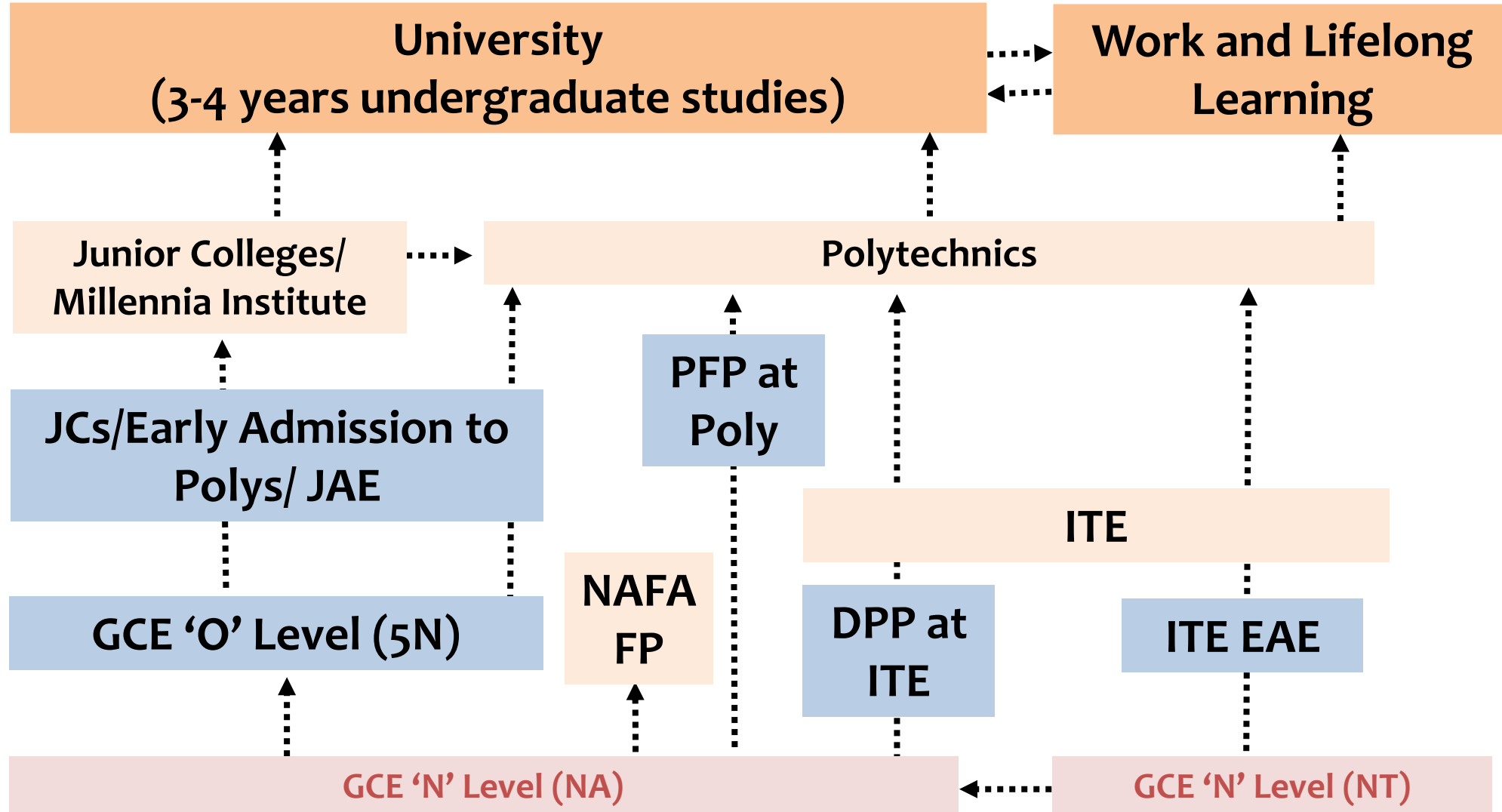

Post-Secondary Options

For Pupils on the *Normal (Technical) course*,

3 options

using GCE 'N' level results

Progression of Sec 4N (Technical) to Sec 4N (Academic)

- Grade A for English Language (EL);
- Grade A for Mathematics (MA); and
- Grade B or better for one other subject at the N(T)-level in one sitting



Sec 4 N(A) Course

on Programme at ITE

2 + 1 Year Career Core curriculum

Examples of Nitec Courses	Cut-off Point Aggregate (4 GCE 'N' Subjects)
Nitec in Digital Animation <i>Shortlisted applicants have to attend an interview and aptitude test.</i>	9 (CC-AM)
Nitec in Business Services <i>This course comprises 3 months of Industry Attachment.</i>	9 (CW-AM)
Nitec in Hospitality Operations <i>This course comprises 6 months of Industry Attachment.</i>	7 (CW-CK)
Nitec in Video Production <i>Shortlisted applicants have to attend an interview and aptitude test.</i>	8 (CC-AM)
Nitec in Retail Services <i>This course comprises 6 months of Industry Attachment.</i>	11 (CW-AM)

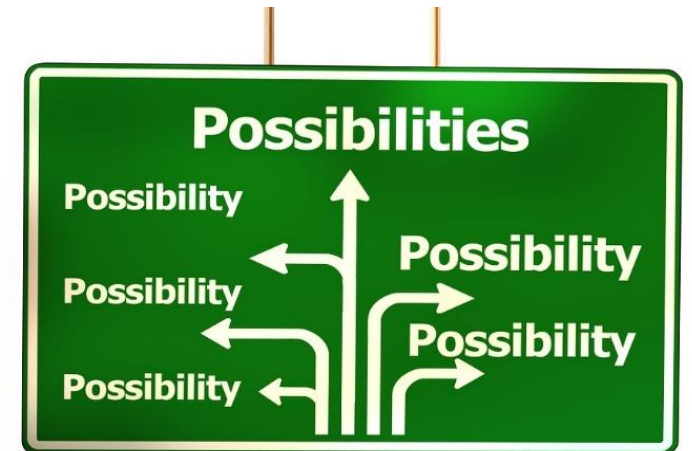

- ❑ Opportunity to seek admission to the post secondary education institutes (ITE, Polytechnics and JCs) before N and O level examinations
- ❑ Based on a diverse range of academic and non-academic achievements talents, aptitude and interest

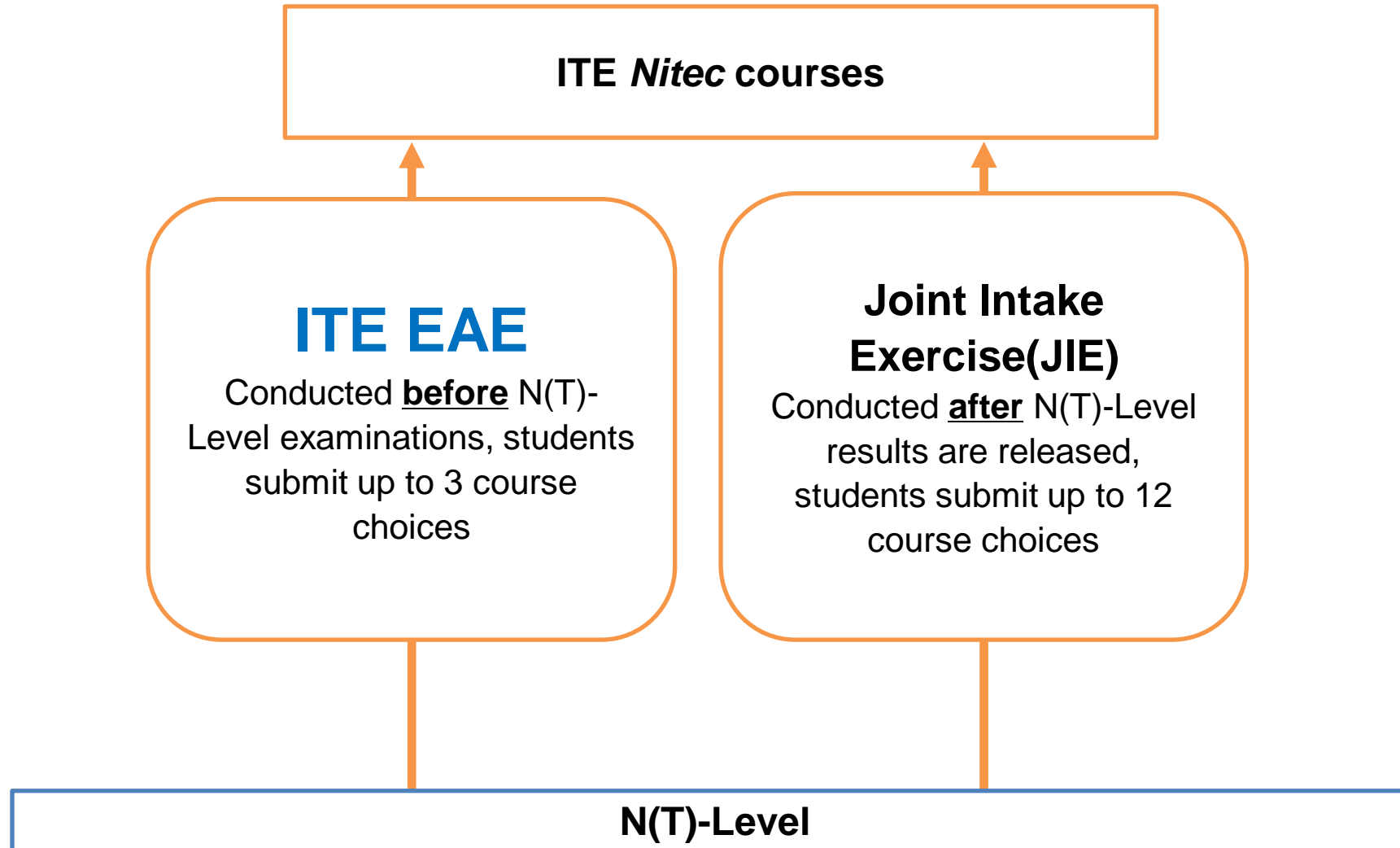

Early Admission exercise

1 It's for those who have *aptitudes* and *interests* in specific fields of study

- Focus on **course-specific aptitudes and interests**
- But, non-course-specific achievements, e.g. sports, performing arts, leadership, are also considered

2 Assessed through different modes

- E.g. interviews, aptitude tests, showcasing your portfolio, depending on the course you apply for

3 Take place *before* N-Level exams

- If your child's application is successful, he/she will be given a **conditional offer** before he/she take the N- Level exams

Early Admission exercise

4 Still have to meet the minimum entry requirements

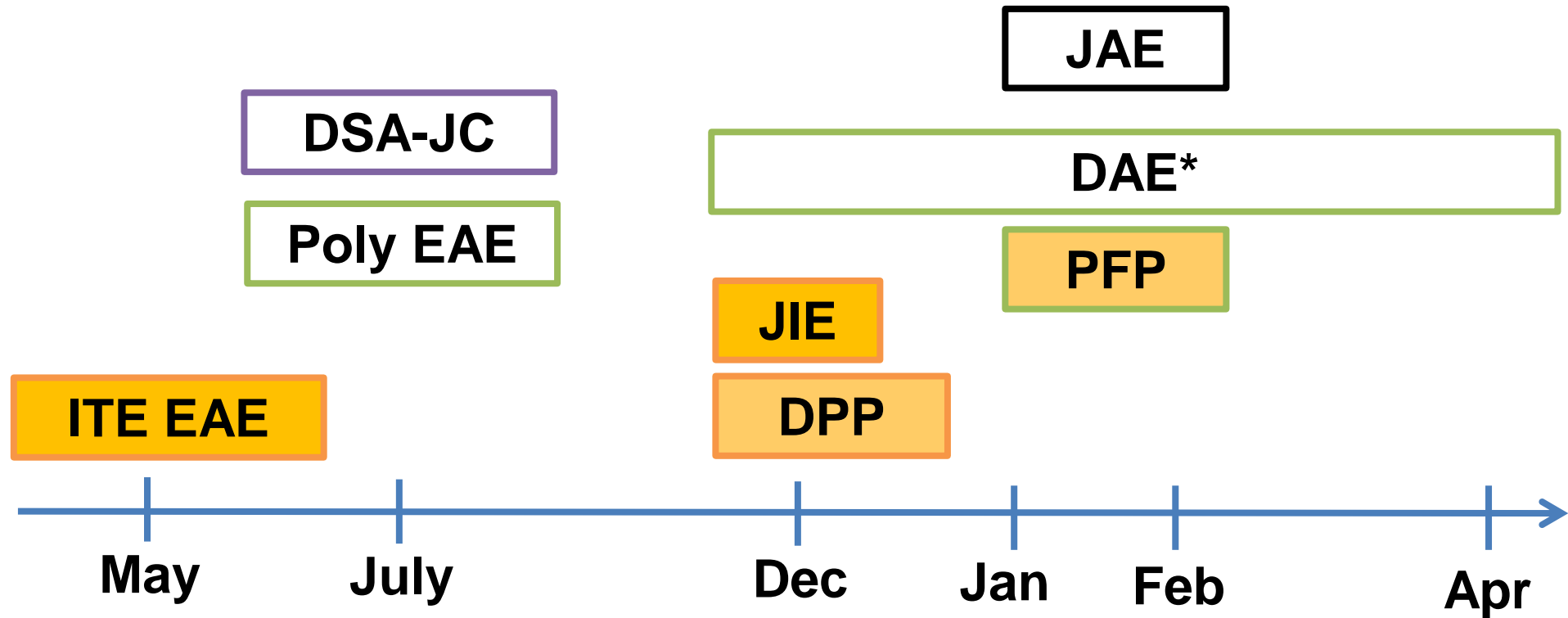
- **ITE:** Most *Nitec* or *Higher Nitec* courses have **subject-specific minimum entry requirements**

- **Polytechnics:** Minimum entry requirements for the polytechnic course (Net ELR2B2 score of **26 points or better** at O-Levels)

(...or your child's offer will be revoked)

5 But your child won't have to compete for admission to the PSEIs strictly on the basis of how well he/she does academically compared to everyone else
