Assessment & Progression



Assessment Structure and Weightage

The academic performance of a student is assessed regularly to gauge progress in learning as well as to provide timely feedback:

- a) Weighted Assessments (W.A)
- e.g. Alternative assessments, class quizzes, project work, practical tests and written assignments, etc
- b) Semestral Assessment (S.A)
- e.g. End-of-year Examinations

Full SBB Subject Level Flexibility

- At the end of S1, students will generally progress to S2 and offer subjects at the same subject levels
- Students offering most subjects at G1 or G2 who perform well in EL, MTL, Math and Science can offer these subjects at a more demanding level (MDL) <u>from Secondary 1</u>
- Students offering most subjects at G1 or G2 who perform well in EL and Humanities can offer Geography, History and/or EL Literature at MDL from Secondary 2
- Students offering subjects at G1 or G2 who do well in individual subjects can offer these subjects at MDL at end of S1 Sem 1 / Sem 2
- Students who attempt MDL and cannot cope can initiate the request to offer the subject at a less demanding level (LDL) and school will assess based on holistic considerations

Eligibility for consideration to offer subject at MDL:



HBL Days in Term 1

- Home Based Learning (HBL) Day takes place once per Even Week:
 - ➤ HBL Day 1 24 Jan (Fri) (Term 1 Week 3)
 - HBL Day 2 6 Feb (Thu) (Term 1 Week 5)
 - ➤ HBL Day 3 19 Feb (Wed) (Term 1 Week 7)
 - HBL Day 4 4 Mar (Tue) (Term 1 Week 9)

Why HBL?

- MOE has announced that all secondary schools will progressively implement Blended Learning – BL consists of home-based and school-based learning
- This provides students with more opportunities to learn at their own pace and to have greater ownership of their learning

Details of HBL

- On HBL Days, students will not report to school. There will also be no CCA on HBL Days (except during competition session for specific CCAs only).
- To ensure that our Sec 1 students have the right mindset towards HBL and develop good HBL habits for the rest of the year, the first HBL Day on 24 Jan will be HBL Initiation Day.
- During HBL Initiation Day, the school will guide students on how HBL Day should be carried out at home.

Self-Study Period

- During Self-Study Period, students are encouraged to use the time to revise and prepare for upcoming WAs / examinations
- Students may choose to quietly study together in small groups and seek clarification from each other or the teacher supervising SSP
- Do encourage your child to make fruitful use of SSP, as it's a good opportunity for him/her to seek clarification from peers / teachers
