C) NATIONAL DIGITAL LITERACY PROGRAMME (NDLP)

Personalised Digital Learning Programme (PDLP) @ JSS

In March 2020, the Ministry of Education (MOE) introduced the National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP) across schools and Institutes of Higher Learning to enhance students' digital literacy skills. A key element of the NDLP is the Personalised Digital Learning Programme (PDLP), aimed at equipping every secondary school student with a school-prescribed Personal Learning Device (PLD) by the end of 2021.

The intended outcomes of PDLP@JSS are:

- 1. Enhance teaching and learning
 - PLDs harness technology for greater effectiveness in teaching and learning, enabled by teachers' use of e-pedagogy to provide learning experiences for students
- 2. Support self-directed and collaborative learning
 - PLDs enable students to learn online according to their needs and interests and to collaborate with each other, anytime and anywhere
- 3. Support the development of digital literacies
 - PLDs provide an immersive environment for students to develop the dispositions, knowledge and skills to thrive in digital environments

Students will use iPads as their PLDs to support teaching and learning activities. The cost of the device can be covered using your child's Edusave account, after reserving funds for miscellaneous fees. Additional details will be shared when school reopens in 2026.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION AND ROAD SAFETY ADVISORY

A) GETTING TO JSS

By Bus

- From Boon Lay MRT Station: 30, 98, 240, 246 (Alight at **Gate 5**, back gate along Corporation Drive), 154 (Alight at **Gate 2**, front gate along Yuan Ching Road)
- From Lakeside MRT Station: 49, 154 (Alight at **Gate 2**, front gate along Yuan Ching Road)

By Mass Rapid Transit

- Alight at Lakeside Station. Take bus service 98 or take bus service 154, 240 or 246 from the bus stop opposite the MRT station.
- Alight at Boon Lay Station and take bus service 30 or 154.
- Alight at Clementi Station and take bus service 154.
- Alight at Jurong East Station and take bus service 98.

By Car/ Taxi

• Use the AYE, Exit 15B, Jalan Ahmad Ibrahim



B) Bus Concession Pass Matters

All students admitted to Secondary 1 in January 2026 can continue to use their primary level School Smart Cards (SSCs) for concessionary travel till end-April 2026. They can purchase the Bus Concession Pass (BCP) using their primary level SSCs to continue to enjoy the concessionary travel while waiting for their secondary level SSCs to be ready. Do note that they must purchase the BCP for secondary school students.

C) ROAD SAFETY ADVISORY

In view of the heavy morning traffic conditions at Jurong Secondary School, please note the following:

- Parents who are driving, please enter using the main gate along Yuan Ching Road. Your child should alight at the car porch area in front of the school's General Office, before the reporting time at 7.30 am on Mon, Tue, Thu and Fri, and 8.20am on Wed. We seek all parents' understanding to exit the school immediately after your child alights, to ease traffic flow and in consideration of others' convenience.
- Students using the front gate are to enter the school by **Gate 2** along Yuan Ching Road (near the traffic light) and not the main gate, which is for vehicular access only.
- Students using the back gate (**Gate 5**) along Corporation Drive will be able to enter the school from 6.30am to 7.30am. On Wed, Gate 5 will be open from 6.30am to 8.20am. In the event of wet weather, entrance via Gate 5 will be extended to 7.45am on Mon, Tue, Thu and Fri, and 8.45am on Wed.
- After 7.30am on Mon, Tue, Thu and Fri and 8.20am on Wed, the school's vehicular traffic barriers
 will be lowered and security checks will be in operation. We seek all parents' understanding to
 cooperate with our security guards, for the safety and security of our school.

CONSENT FOR PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEOS

Photography and videography of students take place during school programmes, activities and events. The school uses these photos and videos on various platforms such as online media, reports, newsletters, other school events, and as publicity or outreach material.

ONLINE CONSENT FOR DENTAL SERVICES (SECONDARY SCHOOL DENTAL PROGRAMME)

To promote good oral health, the Health Promotion Board provides free dental checks and basic dental treatments (if required) at specified times during school hours in secondary schools.

Parents must give their consent before their children can receive such services.

The Health Promotion Board has launched the Consent Portal for parents to submit consent online.

1. Log on to https://consent.hpb.gov.sg OR scan the QR code below to access the Consent Portal.



- 2. Login using your SingPass with 2-factor authentication (2FA). (You may register for SingPass by visiting https://www.singpass.gov.sg OR any SingPass counter. The location of SingPass counters and instructions for 2FA activation are available at https://www.singpass.gov.sg.)
- 3. Fill in and submit the consent form.

The Health Promotion Board receives enrolment information progressively in batches. Should you be prompted at step 3 that HPB has not received your child's / ward's enrolment information, please provide HPB with your email address via the portal. You will be notified via email once HPB receives your child's / ward's enrolment information.

Hard copy consent forms will be distributed to students who are unable to submit their consent online.
