




What is the Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) about?


Things You
Should Know

- 1 It's for those who have aptitudes and interests in specific fields of study
 - Focus on course-specific aptitudes and interests
 - But, non-course-specific achievements, e.g. sports, performing arts, leadership, are also considered
 - Assessed through different modes
 - E.g. interviews, aptitude tests, showcasing your portfolio, depending on the course you apply for
 - Take place *before* N-Level exams
 - If your child's application is successful, he/she will be given a conditional offer before he/she take the N- Level exams

- 4 Still have to meet the minimum entry requirements
 - ITE: Most *Nitec* or *Higher Nitec* courses have **subject- specific minimum entry requirements**

(...or your child's offer will be revoked)

5 But your child won't have to compete for admission to the PSEIs strictly on the basis of how well he/she does academically compared to everyone else
